Just as God was breathing the first breaths of life into Sharing Hope Ministry, He was also planting the seeds for bigger things. One of the early passionate supporters of Sharing Hope was Patsy Britting, and one of Patsy's dreams was that Sharing Hope could help rebuild women's lives beyond the foundations our work lays in the jails and prisons. We rejoice that God's Word has been the literal life-preserver for thousands of the incarcerated women we have served. But what if we could nurture and mentor them in a homelike setting where they could continue to develop and grow in their walk with Christ? What if...? Patsy is no longer with us, having gone to be with the Lord. But her dream never left us, and the seed planted so long ago has not been forgotten.

In 2006 the Board of Sharing Hope began praying about and considering possibilities for Patsy's Place and God began providing donations, some small, some unbelievable. One very generous donation, the "Psalm 119:11" donation, was given to put wings on this dream of hiding God's word in women's hearts through a transitional housing ministry.

Through God's abundant generosity and grace, we have been provided a 10,000 square foot building made available at a fraction of its value. This property may easily be developed into a residential setting for the women we will be mentoring, as well as one day housing our administrative headquarters. Patsy's Place is becoming reality! But there is still much work to be done before the first woman is served as the building will require fairly extensive (and expensive!) renovation. All of this will be accomplished while the core mission of Sharing Hope Ministry continues undiminished.

Why is Patsy's Place important? In short, it will change the lives of our clients and impact our community. Statistics show that the typical incarcerated woman will re-offend and re-enter the correctional system within 18 months—at a rate of some 80%. But for women who are involved with transitional programming such as Patsy's Place, the recidivism rate drops to between 3 and 37%.

We are thrilled that Patsy's Place is finally becoming more than just a dream and your generosity towards Sharing Hope Ministry now has the means to do even more. Please accept our gratitude for your faithful and consistent support; and if God moves you with a sense of what can be accomplished through the additional ministry of Patsy's Place—then dig even a bit deeper and join us in amazement as we watch the very hand of God's blessing further the work that is the very heart of Sharing Hope.

I met "Sandra" at the park on the day that I brought her a bag of basic necessities...Shampoo, soap and deodorant. She was overwhelmed with receiving the items and the list of area programs that could help her find a job and get plugged into recovery classes. Sandra had gone to a job interview earlier but her clothes were dirty and she didn't have shampoo or even a brush. She had lost everything. The simple act of providing basic supplies had given her hope that she could get back on her feet. Sharing Hope Ministry provides the basic hygiene items, a list of area resources, bus tickets and a Bible study for any qualified woman who calls looking for help.

Over 1,540 total items were collected and passed on for our ministry's use in our after care program. The losing department had to provide the winners with desserts of their choice.
