Then there are times when He cuts to the chase and you receive a phone call that is so unexpected that you can only laugh and praise God. That's what recently happened for Sharing Hope Ministry.

Thanks to a bequest from the Leo Caiafa, Jr. Irrevocable Trust, Sharing Hope Ministry will be building the Lucille and Leo Caiafa, Jr. Center for Advancement. This building will allow us to expand the educational portion of the Patsy's Place Transitional Home's aftercare and recovery curriculum and increase the general aftercare services that can be offered to the community.

The building will be located on property already owned by Sharing Hope Ministry. This expansion will provide a large classroom, a computer lab, a multipurpose room for the interns, training space and room for special events. There will be several meeting rooms and we'll be able to add storage for food, clothing and furniture, all of which can benefit post-offending women in the Texas Panhandle. The current classroom, which is located upstairs in Patsy's Place Transitional Home, will be turned into a second living room. This new living area will relieve an overcrowding issue by freeing up space for the women who live in this home. We look forward to the additional growth opportunities that will not only benefit the programs of Sharing Hope Ministry but also the community in general. Our goal is to begin construction this fall with a completion date of June 2017.

Leo Caiafa, Jr. was a local businessman who had a deep history with the building that now is home to all the programs of Sharing Hope Ministry. In 2010 Leo generously underwrote the cost to build one of the participant's bedrooms at Patsy's Place Transitional home and Leo continued to be a supporter of this ministry. A very special heart-felt thank you goes to Leo's sister, Christine SanFilippo and the rest of family of Leo Caiafa, Jr. for providing this gift.

The new Hands of Hope Internship program was created to provide the women who live at Patsy's Place with improved job skills and with experience working in a professional setting. Our goal is to assist the women in finding better paying jobs with opportunities for advancement. Patsy's Place women are interning at the Sharing Hope Ministry office but it is our hope to partner with other employers who can offer our interns productive and meaningful work assignments with a learning component. Practical on-the-job training provides the residents with a competitive edge and confidence when they seek full-time employment after completing the first phase of the Patsy's Place program.

I just wanted to get out and go back to having a normal life.
