

Susan DeFace Washington was just your typical girl, born into a typical middle-class family. She was the youngest of three children, living what everyone thought was a typical life. Turns out, everyone was wrong.

Susan and her family endured heartbreaking tragedies and crippling addictions that devastated and almost destroyed them. Susan, alone, survived.

Her story will take you from her years as a cheerleader, to being a special education teacher and ultimately to being a convicted felon, serving time and working on the prison pig farm, cleaning the slabs and feeding the pigs.

It's the story of a woman struggling to survive the suicide of an older brother, the untimely death of an older sister, and the paralyzing alcoholism of her parents, who, in their grief, left her to care for herself for too much of her young life.

Susan struggles with the demons her dysfunctional childhood has caused, turns to drug addiction, is convicted of manufacturing and selling methamphetamines and serves a felony prison sentence. During this time she learns what is most important in life and what the phrase "pulling chain" really means.

Her drug use has cost her many things, including time with her children, and her certificate as a Texas Educator. But, as funny as it sounds, it has also given her some gifts; the realization that her sobriety is vital to her life and her belief in God that is vital to her sobriety.




A Year Full of Growth

Looking back at 2019, the year seems like a blur. There were many memorable moments including celebrating twenty years of sending the *Life Recovery Bible* to incarcerated and recovering women. Volunteers have now sent 159,808 *Life Recovery Bibles* since 1999! It was also exciting to have our dear friend, Jud Wilhite, with us at Hope Fest, and we began a partnership with Amarillo College to offer GED classes to post-offending and at-risk women. Volunteers, staff and our Board of Directors spent months in prayer and in meetings, and have completed our 3-5 year strategic plan...let's be honest, 2019 involved a lot of hard work!

We are now renewed with an excitement and passion for reaching the goals of this strategic plan, and in bringing glory to God through this ministry. While 2019 was a great year, 2020 will most certainly bring growth to all of our programs!

Sharing Hope Ministry will be offering a *Spanish Life Recovery Bible*. Our volunteers are currently translating our forms to Spanish so that more women can be introduced to Christ. Volunteers will also be providing new aftercare materials to women across Texas to help them be more successful as they re-enter our communities.



Patsy's Place Transitional Home is adding additional recovery support to our curriculum and we have changed our program to better work with women who have different obstacles to their success.

The Center for Advancement has grown so much since we opened it in the fall of 2017! Our goal in 2020 is to build more partnerships with area organizations and businesses to provide relevant and impactful resources to more atrisk women from our community. We hope to increase the amount of services provided to our area women.

Please pray for this ministry as it continues to grow and we implement new services and changes to our existing programs. As for us, we are going to do just what 1 Timothy 4:15 says to do which is, "Give your complete attention to these matters. Throw yourself into your tasks so that everyone will see your progress."
